Thank you for taking the time to write this lengthy email. I appreciate all the hard work you are doing for the employees of this school. I share your concern for fellow employees on campus as I know people whose jobs are threatened. Part of what frustrates me about the current budget situation is that I foresaw the problems 3 years ago and pursued outside funding. At a brainstorming meeting in 2012 with the former director of sponsored programs, that was also attended by BJ Reed and former assoc. dean Lisa Riedle, my cyberprogram initiative was hailed as the most promising idea. If we had taken the route I proposed we could have a great cash cow in place now that would have secured many jobs on campus. But after I assisted a student in reporting a sexual harassment incident against a professor I became a persona non-grata in my department and was defamed to the dean's office. My cyber crime initiative was destroyed and along with it the hope for outside funding. If my complaints had been properly and timely addressed you would not be working so hard to protect people's jobs now.

I understand your time-constraint and thank you for the time you have set aside for me in the past months. It is hard to be patient after having been deprived of justice at this school for over 2 years. I
