Thank you, Sabina.

Couple of notes--and an idea for Caitlyn below.

Your forwarding potential candidates is always welcome and appreciated.

I'm going to try to hold the Dana Cecil position open for now; Cheryl will assume Dana's undergrad online duties for next semester, and I'll try to handle the outreach components such as they are. Part of this is to really get a handle on what that position was, and do we need to continue it as it was?

And I may end up need to find someone to do a 1/4 or 1/2-time slot doing what Dana was doing; as we go forward, let's try to figure out what it was, and what it might or should be.

In the searches ongoing, there were a couple of interesting candidates who did not meet minimums but who might be possibilities as teaching academic staff. I'm hanging onto their contact info, and it might make sense to think about them as possible academic staff w/r/t teaching and if that worked out, perhaps that position would be the place for them.

Part of this, too, is leaving some flexibility for a new chair; she/he may have different ideas and I don't want to tie her/his hands any more than I have to. So if we can get through this next semester OK, or at least well into it, we can think more strategically as to how that position might be used.

It's also a question of whether we need or want someone to duplicate what Dana did. I'm not sure we need a half-time outreach coordinator; not sure we don't. So I don't want to just replace Dana without considering whether there's something better we might be doing with that position.

Now, having said that--Caitlyn sounds like she may be an interesting candidate for the position Deb Rice is vacating as she moves into Ed Ross' position. That position was just posted yesterday and here is the link for that:

Please pass that link on to her.

The ad says "lecturer" but the expectation is to teach just two courses a semester (and no more than three); it involves doing more things than just teaching, and it's full-time, 12-months (Deb was half-time in the summer). It'll involve coordination of internships, advising, registration, handling student visits, admin support of our new Living/Learning Community, and some other things as well. We need someone w/ at least a Masters degree, and I think being a UW-P grad is a plus. This may be something she might be interested in.

So, we're going to let the Dana position lie fallow for a bit while the other things work their way out, but please have Caitlyn look at this other position.

I want to clarify why the curriculum committee was set up as it is as well as provide my response to the entire department so that we are all operating with the same information. I set up a department election for a five-person committee; the bylaws of the department allow for a larger committee, but the larger the committee, the more difficult to find meeting times and coordinate its efforts.

Indeed, no one expressed any objection to me at the time we set up the election either as regards to the proposed size of the committee or the process for voting and ranking.

After the voting was complete, Sheri and Rex counted the rankings, double-checked the results, and those elected were the ones I passed on

to the Department via email.

The basis purpose of the Curriculum Committee is "to review prospective classes and establish some minimum criteria for content of course. [sic] Applies for undergraduate and graduate courses." I expect it will do that. I asked Amy to convene the committee, and at that meeting the committee should elect a chair from its ranks.

With regard to broader issues of curriculum review and redevelopment, there's no reason why anyone's ideas and input should be excluded; who knows from where good ideas might spring?

I would like the Curriculum Committee to begin that process, but they are not the only ones who can or should be involved with that. I expect the Committee will welcome relevant input from the rest of the Department or from other experts where it is offered--and I would like them to report to us from time to time as to their work.

Please remember that this is an ongoing project and nothing is set in stone. At this stage we are looking at a solid beginning for such an important task, and I believe it will eventually become a department-wide discussion and decision.

Please also remember that we will be undergoing reaccreditation in 2016, and a large part of that is the creation of Student Learning Outcomes, both at the program level as well as the individual course level. We will be needing a process to ensure different sections of the same course meet--and assess--the same Student Learning Outcomes.

There will be more than enough work to go around. Let's hope we survive it!

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Yesterday in the Milwaukee Journal-Sentinel was an article describing recruiting at UW-system schools and specifically highlighting us. You might find it an interesting read:

The question was raised at our faculty meeting as to whether the filling of the chair position with a tenure track, in addition to the other three positions currently under search, would somehow eliminate the Ross position which had been filing the vacated David Van Buren line.

It was a good question, as I'd been under the impression, and clearly I was not alone :) that there are fixed numbers of tenure lines and are attached to specific positions.

Turns out that isn't how it is done. Cheryl and I consulted Katie Curry about it and if I understand it correctly, those lines are assigned or removed at the Dean level, and there are other salary resources that will be applied to the chair position. Regardless, there is no influence on the Ross position by the chair search or the filling of that position with another tenure line.

So the moving of Deb Rice into Ed Ross' position can be done without concern for suddenly losing that line, and being without a position we need filled.

Good question and I appreciate it being asked early in the process so that we didn't discover late in the game that we had a problem.

Sabina:

As I stated in our meeting we're doing a combined committee as we did last year to be more efficient. I asked Cheryl to serve as chair; she asked that I appoint Pat, and after some consultations we all agreed this was acceptable.

Everyone who is on the search committee this year, save Amy who is

working on retention projects for us, were not on the final committee last year (recall the FI search failed). Those people are on this year's search committee.

You chaired a search last year that produced two hired candidates. My thinking is it's only fair to spread the work around.

As to the 700-hour academy or Rockford project, I've long asked for anyone interested to contact me if they want to be part of it. You had the same opportunities as anyone else, insofar as I know. As examples, my June 5 email makes just such an invitation regarding the 700-hour academy, while my January 16 email invites the same for Rockford. I have forwarded both to you.

I chose Tom for the FI program because he had been chair when it was developed, is teaching an important core course and is, in my judgment, best suited to carry it forward this year while we review it in the department curriculum committee.

I made the decision on mentoring based upon who I thought was best suited for that role and would fit best with the individual in question. I anticipate that there will be other mentoring opportunities in the future.

DIANA JOHNSON LEAVING UW-PLATTEVILLE

In a move that surprised many of us, Diana Johnson resigned her position at UW-Platteville on June 4. She is moving to Milwaukee. We wish her the best as she moves on to a new stage in her life.

Obviously we have some position filling to do and work has begun on that. ***If you know of anyone who may be able to fill in for Diana's courses in the fall, please let me***

know.

PERSONNEL ISSUES and SEARCHES

Our next year promises to be busy from a personnel point of view. Here are the position openings:

Ed Ross (retiring December 2014)
Aric Dutelle (June 1 2014)
Diana Johnson (June 4 2014)
Lorne Gibson (leaving UW-Platteville following 2014/15 school year)
Department Chair

I have a meeting scheduled with the Dean and Provost next week, where we will discuss the open positions and other issues. I remain hopeful that we will be allowed to fill them.

I believe personnel issues are intertwined with curriculum, the 700-hour academy, the FI program, the reports of the outside reviewers I sent to you a couple weeks ago, and strategic planning. Turnover in personnel always gives us options and possibilities; sometimes things remain the same.

I expect we will need to do some serious planning as a department as we look at where we are, where we've come from, and where we want to go. Are there courses we should be offering? Courses we no longer need to offer, or which can be revamped to better suit our purposes? Should we be looking at a revamp of the program?

Please have all those ideas in mind as we move through the summer.

700-HOUR ACADEMY

I want to clarify a few things relating to the 700-hour Academy, and our looking at whether we can embed that in our curriculum.

I had hoped to have a department meeting just before we left to clarify some of this, but there were additional potential conditions that may have made the discussion moot, so rather than waste your time we didn't do that.

Rex, Joe, Pat and I have been working on these issues since last October. We've always welcomed input and anyone who wishes to help us sort this out, and the invitation remains.

We've been working to see if it is feasible to embed the Academy within our program without cheapening the 120-credit degree that students normally achieve. Not Rex, nor Pat, nor Joe, nor I want this to become a training curriculum; we're a university, not a training

facility.

And yet, there are redundancies in the Academy curriculum for which our student pay twice; the Academy as the Training and Standards Board envisions it cannot be included under student financial aid; and it greatly delays the entry of students into the workforce, in addition to having greater cost.

As we have moved forward--Pat has been the main person focusing on these issues, with input from others--we've looked to see how we can get students Academy credit for what they're already learning in our program, how we can get the costs subsumed under students' financial aid umbrella, and how to do it within a 4-year time frame.

Some courses might be modified to include the material in a framework that allows students to earn Academy credit in addition to Academic (B.S.) credit. Perhaps we would need to create some new courses, though exactly how that would work isn't clear yet. There may not be room to add things in some courses, or we may need to have students take material outside of class, for which they would receive no Academic (B.S.) credit, but would receive Academy credit. For instance, maybe there would need to be a Monday afternoon Academy class taught by non-UW-Platteville faculty, for Academy credit only. Or Saturday. Or a night "class." Or something else. Students just wouldn't get UW-Platteville credit for it.

The point is that not everything can--or would--be done in our own courses. Much of the material is training-oriented, and doesn't fit our curricular model. That kind of thing doesn't belong in our courses, and nobody yet has expressed any interest in doing that.

As we move forward exploring this possibility, we need to see what can be done, what can't but could under different circumstances, what options we have available, what courses could be adjusted and which cannot, and ultimately how this might be done.

I remain optimistic that we can find ways to do this. We invite and encourage your participation as we move ahead.

And one more note related to this: in my years on City Council and as President of the Common Council, I was asked by many how they might present their ideas to the Council. I'd tell them to anticipate the questions and issues that are likely to be raised by the Council, and be ready to provide answers or solutions.

That's what we've been doing w/r/t the 700-hour Academy--looking at the issues, the problems, seeing what answers and solutions might exist, and being able to present those to the CJ Department faculty. We've tried to anticipate questions and issues and see where they take us. We've looked at all sorts of issues ranging from potential need for additional staff, costs, cost recovery, value to the program, scheduling, financial aid, and so on. That doesn't mean we've uncovered every issue, but we've looked at a lot of them.

And again, anyone who would like to be involved with this, you're more than welcome.

CAUTIONS IN OUR TEACHING

Exams

I want to remind everyone that over-reliance on multiple-choice exams in our classes--especially upper-division classes--is a weak style of assessment. Students can sometimes guess their way to a passing grade where they could never pass an exam that required them to produce that knowledge without being prompted.

While it may occasionally be desirable to include such exam questions, I hope everyone is working to move away from that style of teaching in the upper-division courses and toward more rigorous styles of assessment.

If you would like some ideas on how to do this, please feel free to meet with me or staff at the TLC. There are ways to do this that don't result in huge and difficult grading loads.

As well, an over-reliance on videos in classroom settings is counter to what we provide that no recorded material can provide: face-to-face interaction with highly qualified faculty.

Especially where students may watch videos outside of classroom time, using class time for videos can have the effect of cheating students out of the interaction they've paid for.

This is not to say they should never be used; in the interviewing class, for instance, short clips illustrating mannerisms, body language, and so on are quite appropriate in demonstrating and analyzing interview subjects. And there are other opportunities where video usage in class is appropriate.

Extra Credit

Extra credit is a difficult issue; over-reliance on extra credit can teach students that they do not have to do their best work at the outset, since they know they can "fix" a mediocre performance with extra credit. People will do what we incentivize them to do, and extra credit sometimes gives students incentive to do less than their best.

As well, please be careful in using extra credit in areas that have no content connection to our courses; allowing extra credit for donating blood, for instance, isn't defensible when it comes to assessing our students' performance in our courses. Our assessment should be directly tied to course objectives, and blood donation clearly is not that.

Returning Exams

I have never given an exam which I have not returned to students; all students should be able to take their exams and assess their studying performance in light of where they were successful and where not. That is, if a student missed a question, they should be able to go back and determine what in their study approach failed to work.

I know some of you review exams in class in lieu of returning them to students; I have some concern that this burns up valuable class time as well as not providing students the opportunity to use the exam to go back and assess their studying. Perhaps you overcome this by allowing students to review the exam in your office, but if the purpose of this practice is simply to avoid having to make new exams each time, it opens us up to other issues.

That is, this approach to using the same exam each time depends on absolute certainty that no copy of the exam has leaked out, or that no students have access to the test bank or instructor guide. Please be very careful with this. I had reports last semester of some academic dishonesty on the part of some of our students, which reports I could not substantiate but which I do believe. I had no reports in relation to any particular exam, but we can be sure that if a few students will take liberties in one area, it's likely they'd take them in another.

If our exams are not known to be "pure" in that no student knows what is going to be on them, then we can have issues defending our grading scheme. Let's be sure we don't have these issues.

Group Work

Be careful in how you require group work among students. Unless there is a significant individual component to the group grade, experience indicates that in such groups, the strongest students bear a disproportionate share of the work, as they are the most motivated; weaker students often just hang on the strongest student coattails, earning better grades through the work of other students than they deserve. So it becomes both an equity issue as well as grade inflation issue.

When this happens, our grading schemes come open to criticism. When individual effort is confounded with group results, it isn't as clear what grades mean. I have occasionally used group projects in the past; when I do so, I always use an individual component to the grade, so that students realize that disengaging from the project will not reward them.

If you'd like to explore ways to do this, contact me about it.

Their Money's Worth

I've long used a particular approach to assessing my own teaching. I ask myself, if my own children were in my classes, would I feel they were getting their money's worth? Students pay dearly for every class period in which they are enrolled, so I never want to waste that investment in their education. I always want them to walk out of my classes feeling they received their money's worth for what they received, and a bit more.

REASONS FOR BEING ABSENT

I've been asked what kinds of things are legitimate reasons to miss a class. Of course, illness, or a family member who is ill or for whom we must care or be involved in care, hospitalization, or other related things are legitimate reasons why we must miss a class. Each of us has sick time we can use to accommodate this.

Attending a conference or presenting a paper at a professional meeting is another legitimate reason to miss a class. While it would be nice if these would occur when we don't hold classes, sometimes that's not the case. Maintaining our professional competence is part of our responsibility to our students and this is one way we do that.

Occasionally there may be events which have significant impacts on our students which require us to miss a class. This was something both Pat and Rex experienced in the fall when they went to Madison to deal with issues surrounding the 700-hour academy.

There are ways to deal with this that limit the damage to our students' resulting education. One is to schedule exams during times we must be absent and arranging for proctors to give such exams. I'm available to help with that as are, of course, most of our staff. When that can't happen, perhaps a guest speaker may be scheduled or another faculty member can pinch-hit for us in a topic area in which they have expertise. Finding some way to give our students meaningful educational experiences during their scheduled and paid-for class time should be our priority.

When events provide only short-term opportunities to plan (see the 700-hour academy issues above), that may be difficult, but we should always be striving to give our students what they pay for. I know most of you are diligent in this regard, and I hope the above clarifies this. If you're not sure, talk to me about a proposed absence.

700-HOUR ACADEMY UPDATE

We remain unclear as to the exact ramifications of the 700-hour academy on our students who wish to enter a Law Enforcement career path in Wisconsin--except they don't look good. It makes it more difficult and more expensive for students who do not have an agency sponsorship, and makes it less desirable for students to earn a BS degree prior to entering the academy. Reducing the proportion of our police force who have earned bachelors degrees is not a good thing.

A few of us (Rex Reed, Joe Lomax, Pat Solar and myself) have variously testified at a

legislative hearing, met with DOJ training and standards staff, and met with Rep. Bies who is sponsoring the legislation related to this bill. I met yesterday with Representative Travis Tranel to discuss our concerns as well as the degree of cooperation we've received from DOJ.

One option that is being discussed by Rep. Tranel and DOJ is the option of offering an Academy here at UW-Platteville, where students graduating with a BS with a LE emphasis would be certifiable at graduation, rather than after an additional academy. While appearing attractive at one level, the devil is in the details and much would depend on how flexible DOJ is on how the curriculum is presented and instructor staffing--a flexibility they have yet to demonstrate.

I'd like to talk about this a bit at our meeting on Tuesday. Bring ideas and questions.

ROCKFORD UPDATE

The Rockford initiative to offer advanced standing at UW-Platteville to Rockford HS students who complete coursework there prior to admission here is moving forward. We're at the stage where contract is being discussed.

This has the potential to improve the diversity of our students, pre-prepare students who will be well-positioned to succeed here in our program, provide a good recruitment path for maintaining enrollment numbers, and will even provide us with additional funding--which I'd like to use in part to do things like provide releases for research and ways to reduce some of our section sizes.

Assuming we're able to complete this, our first task will be to find someone who can do teaching from Platteville via distance learning methods. I expect such a position to include not only compensation for the year's teaching, but there is also funding for curriculum development and training and coordination with Rockford personnel who will be involved.

If you'd like to be involved with this, please let me know. Developing/converting FI 1320 curriculum for the first year's class is the first order of business.

The five members whose total ranks are lowest will be elected.

Turn your ballot into Sheri in a sealed envelope, and she will check your name off the list as having voted. Ballots are due next Monday; I'll pick a couple faculty members to help me count the votes.

Deb Rice is being administratively reassigned starting Spring Semester to take Ed Ross' position--as if anyone could ever do that! :) Actually, I'm confident Deb will ably and effectively step in for Ed.

Deb's position is thus open to being filled, and I want that position to become a full-time, full-year position that can help us administratively with things like advising, registration, the forthcoming Living/Learning Communities, transfer registration, visits, and so on. In addition, the position is expected to teach at least two courses per semester. In other words, it's an expansion of things Deb was already doing in that position.

I've asked Deb to form a search committee and Ed Ross and Steve Elmer are working with her on that committee. We're at the Form 1 stage, but the expectation is that we will hire someone for second semester.

The job description as currently drafted includes the following:

1. Provide academic advising to criminal justice/forensic investigation students
2. Register criminal justice/forensic investigation students during summer registration
3. Advise transfer students and aid in their registration
4. Greet and provide information for prospective student visits to include TSI day.
5. Coordinate and proctor the writing proficiency exam.
6. Monitor and coordinate the Internship program
7. Act as a liaison between faculty and the Criminal Justice Living/Learning Community.
Help coordinate activities with the Living/Learning Community and the Criminal Justice faculty.

8. Provide administrative and other support for programs focused on retention of criminal justice students.
9. Teach two classes of Introduction to Criminal Justice each semester
10. Aid in other department duties as necessary

If there are other items you think would be useful in such a position or believe there might be problems/issues with the description as listed, please let Deb or I know ASAP. Part of my hope for this position is that we find ways to streamline advising to reduce its burden on us, so if you have some ideas how that might be done, please don't be shy.

NEW SCHOLARSHIP FOR CJ STUDENT

COMPREHENSIVE COMPONENT IN COURSES

Just a reminder that virtually all our courses should have a comprehensive component to them, in the form of a comprehensive final exam, a project encompassing the elements of the course, something along those lines.

Two exceptions I can think of: the seminar course which has somewhat different outcomes, and internship. Othewise, comprehensive assessment of some form.

In the past I've used comprehensive finals, I've had students in theory do a ridealong from which experience they wrote a long final paper encompassing the ways they observed elements of theory as displayed during the ridealong, had students in an Org Theory course use the concepts and theories to analyze a specific organization and write a long paper drawing together all those themes, and had students in a research methods class submit a research design encompassing everything from conceptualization to method to sampling to measurement to analysis.

So there are multiple ways to skin a cat.

ACCOMMODATION STATEMENTS

Don't forget accommodation statements in your syllabi. This is the item BJ Reed sent out earlier this week, ***but I've saved it and attached it here*** so you don't have to go searching for it.

It includes syllabi musts and shoulds, which is nice, but also the boilerplate for the accommodation statements. Just cut 'n' paste as needed. No need to reinvent the wheel.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Also ensure you have learning objectives in your syllabi. About 6-10 is the right number. Eventually, we're heading to a place in assessment where it is tied directly and clearly to learning objectives so we should keep refining them and ensuring that not only are they assessable, but that we also do it in our evaluation process of students.

DIANA JOHNSON LEAVING UW-PLATTEVILLE

In a move that surprised many of us, Diana Johnson resigned her position at UW-Platteville on June 4. She is moving to Milwaukee. We wish her the best as she moves on to a new stage in her life.

Obviously we have some position filling to do and work has begun on that. ***If you know of anyone who may be able to fill in for Diana's courses in the fall, please let me know.***

PERSONNEL ISSUES and SEARCHES

Our next year promises to be busy from a personnel point of view. Here are the position openings:

Ed Ross (retiring December 2014)

Aric Dutelle (June 1 2014)

Diana Johnson (June 4 2014)

Lorne Gibson (leaving UW-Platteville following 2014/15 school year)

Department Chair

I have a meeting scheduled with the Dean and Provost next week, where we will discuss the open positions and other issues. I remain hopeful that we will be allowed to fill them.

I believe personnel issues are intertwined with curriculum, the 700-hour academy, the FI program, the reports of the outside reviewers I sent to you a couple weeks ago, and strategic planning. Turnover in personnel always gives us options and possibilities; sometimes things remain the same.

I expect we will need to do some serious planning as a department as we look at where we are, where we've come from, and where we want to go. Are there courses we should be offering? Courses we no longer need to offer, or which can be revamped to better suit our purposes? Should we be looking at a revamp of the program?

Please have all those ideas in mind as we move through the summer.

700-HOUR ACADEMY

I want to clarify a few things relating to the 700-hour Academy, and our looking at whether we can embed that in our curriculum.

I had hoped to have a department meeting just before we left to clarify some of this, but there were additional potential conditions that may have made the discussion moot, so rather than waste your time we didn't do that.

Rex, Joe, Pat and I have been working on these issues since last October. We've always welcomed input and anyone who wishes to help us sort this out, and the invitation remains.

We've been working to see if it is feasible to embed the Academy within our program without cheapening the 120-credit degree that students normally achieve. Not Rex, nor Pat, nor Joe, nor I want this to become a training curriculum; we're a university, not a training facility.

And yet, there are redundancies in the Academy curriculum for which our student pay twice; the Academy as the Training and Standards Board envisions it cannot be included under student financial aid; and it greatly delays the entry of students into the workforce, in addition to having greater cost.

As we have moved forward--Pat has been the main person focusing on these issues, with input from others--we've looked to see how we can get students Academy credit for what they're already learning in our program, how we can get the costs subsumed under students' financial aid umbrella, and how to do it within a 4-year time frame.

Some courses might be modified to include the material in a framework that allows students to earn Academy credit in addition to Academic (B.S.) credit. Perhaps we would need to create some new courses, though exactly how that would work isn't clear yet. There may not be room to add things in some courses, or we may need to have students take material outside of class, for which they would receive no Academic (B.S.) credit, but would receive Academy credit. For instance, maybe there would need to be a Monday afternoon Academy class taught by non-UW-Platteville faculty, for Academy credit only. Or Saturday. Or a night "class." Or something else. Students just wouldn't get UW-Platteville credit for it.

The point is that not everything can--or would--be done in our own courses. Much of the material is training-oriented, and doesn't fit our curricular model. That kind of thing doesn't belong in our courses, and nobody yet has expressed any interest in doing that.

As we move forward exploring this possibility, we need to see what can be done, what can't but could under different circumstances, what options we have available, what courses could be adjusted and which cannot, and ultimately how this might be done.

I remain optimistic that we can find ways to do this. We invite and encourage your participation as we move ahead.

And one more note related to this: in my years on City Council and as President of the Common Council, I was asked by many how they might present their ideas to the Council. I'd tell them to anticipate the questions and issues that are likely to be raised by the Council, and be ready to provide answers or solutions.

That's what we've been doing w/r/t the 700-hour Academy--looking at the issues, the problems, seeing what answers and solutions might exist, and being able to present those to the CJ Department faculty. We've tried to anticipate questions and issues and see where they take us. We've looked at all sorts of issues ranging from potential need for additional staff, costs, cost recovery, value to the program, scheduling, financial aid, and so on. That doesn't mean we've uncovered every issue, but we've looked at a lot of them.

And again, anyone who would like to be involved with this, you're more than welcome.

ARIC DUTELLE TAKING NEW POSITION

Aric Dutelle has submitted his resignation; my understanding is that Aric is leaving us at the end of the academic year (June 1?) for a new opportunity in Oregon.

We wish Aric the best as he pursues this new opportunity.

ED ROSS POSITION SEARCH

Cheryl Fuller is chairing the search for Ed Ross's replacement (not that Ed can ever be replaced, but rather, we'll find someone to fill his position :). Rex Reed and Amy Nemmetz are also on that search committee; so too is Audera Cox, one of our students.

The plan is to put out an ad in early-to-mid July with a closing date in early September, and from which time the review and interviewing process will proceed.

If you know of anyone who might be interested in the position please point them toward the hiring process and encourage them to apply. I will forward to you a copy of the position description and ad when it has gone through final approval.

OUTSIDE REVIEWER REPORTS

I've received the final reports from both Allen Ault and Stan Stojkovic; I have attached them to this email.

The reports are interesting; I'm not sure I completely agree with everything that is said, but at the same time, I tend to place a great deal of credence in the reports given the long and distinguished careers of both reviewers, and that they are deans of their respective units.

We need to do some thinking and planning as a result of these reports as well as other issues including pending personnel changes. I don't want us to do a knee-jerk reaction to any of this, but we should think carefully about their recommendations and come together as colleagues to assess their suggestions and implement meaningful changes as makes sense.

GRADUATING SENIOR COMMENTS FROM FI COURSE

Allen Ault met with a couple of classes, and some of his interaction with those students finds its way into his report. I asked one student to collate responses from graduating seniors in FI as to suggestions about the program; that is the third attachment.

I find all of the suggestions interesting; not all are necessarily implementable but there are some good ideas there. If I had to characterize the suggestions it's that students *want more*. Please take those into account as well as we think about this.

700-HOUR ACADEMY UPDATE

I'd hoped to have had a department meeting this week whose primary purpose would be to discuss the 700-hour academy issue (now up to 714 hours), but we were still waiting for information that would have helped place things in context, and it came in too late.

Pat, Rex, and Joe have been working with me on this issue; we believe there is a way to embed the academy in our curriculum in such a way to eliminate the redundancies in education inherent in the way the current academy is done, without turning our program into a training curriculum. We don't train, we educate. We have no intention of losing that.

There has not been as much cooperation from Training and Standards as we might have liked, and this will inform us as we move forward. There are opportunities here which leads us to the next topic:

STRATEGIC PLANNING

I want to have a strategic planning process begun before the fall semester kicks off. Perhaps a retreat, perhaps an outside facilitator, perhaps something else. The outside reviewer reports should serve as a place of departure for us to discuss the future of the overall program and we need to think about those things in terms of enrollment, job opportunities, and future department reputation.

I will be back to you with further information on this; if you have any ideas or suggestions on how this might proceed, please let me know.

Have a great summer; it's been a long and difficult year for everyone, in more ways than one. Rest, recharge, and be prepared to think creatively as we move forward this fall.

As most of you know, the college and university are in a financial bind such that we, as a college, must come up with a \$400,000 budget reduction for the next budget cycle.

I met with Dean Throop on Friday to discuss options; position cuts escaped the first go-around, but we looked carefully at other places to

find resources.

It seemed clear, as a result of our meeting, that internship compensation will be evaluated and quite possibly, adjusted downward. How far, I do not know yet, but it seems equally clear that the days where faculty would receive 1/60.5 of their annual salary per student supervised, are ending.

I will do my best to encourage a fair and reasonable compensation for the internships we supervise, but I expect the amount paid, at the high end, to be reduced. In case any of your summer or other future plans were dependent upon a specific compensation based on previous year's pay, please be advised that it's likely to be less.

I have another meeting scheduled with the Dean to discuss the specifics; I will let you know as soon as possible what the result is.

Last night the Rockford School Board approved the agreement between Rockford Public Schools and UW-Platteville to offer dual-enrollment courses.

There are variations as to how it will be offered, but the ideal scenario is to have someone on their staff teach it; that kind of person is hard to find (they actually have someone who is a former police officer on staff with a Masters degree, but he's at a different school), but maybe.

If that doesn't work, next step is to hire someone onto their staff with proper qualifications (Masters in CJ or Education or related field, plus policing or related experience). If that doesn't work, then a third alternative is for us to hire someone down there to teach it; finally, if none of that is possible, we'll do it remotely from here.

If you know of anyone in Rockford or vicinity who might be interested in doing this, or either/both of the follow-on courses Evidence Collection and Preservation or Intro to CJ, please let them (and me!) know.

Mr. Anderson has missed assignments, been late for or did not come in for appointments, has been late on advising, and generally seems to be approaching his studies in a way that isn't likely to be successful for him. Dr. Burton has indicated she has some inkling that there may be family issues underlying this problem, but the specifics she is not clear on.

I have asked Dr. Burton to ask Mr. Anderson to come in and see me about these issues, and I will see what I can determine about them. In the meantime, I would like Mr. Anderson to be on your radar. There is no indication he is a threat to harm himself or others, but his approach to school is not one likely to meet with success.

Dr. Ault's bio is here: <http://justice.eku.edu/about/deanBio.php> I think you'd agree that his experience both in the field as well as academia make him an interesting candidate for this exercise.

Much like the SWOT exercise of a few weeks back, I would like Dr. Ault--and Dr. Stojkavich later this month--to look for areas of strengths we should maintain or embellish, areas of weakness we should examine and shore up if necessary, opportunities we may be missing (structurally, programmatically or otherwise), and threats to where we are as well as where we are going.

I don't see how either can do this without a chance to talk to you. Much like how an anthropologist might work to uncover the culture of a society by embedding themselves in that culture, so too I hope both Dr. Ault and Dr. Stojkavich can clearly see who and what we are.

I have no preconceived notions here. I am a scientist; the data speaks. Let's find out what outsiders have to say about us. We can either view that as a threat or an opportunity. If treated as the former, it's a waste of everyone's time; if the latter, it might just help us strengthen a program that has many fine attributes.

I've attached the tentative schedule below; some of the times are shorter due to the need to move across campus, and in a couple cases squeezing into the schedule. If you haven't a spot on the schedule, let me know.

A while back I met with most of you to look at SWOT: strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats. There were a few themes that emerged though there was less consensus than I might have expected. Here are the places of, if not consensus, then at least a few people agreeing:

Strengths: Faculty, agency contacts, reputation.

Weaknesses: Internal politics and Interpersonal issues, salaries, FI rigor

Opportunities: Rockford project, FICSH, Embedded academy, Training

opportunities in FI/CJ

Threats: 700-hour academy

There were many other thoughtful answers, the above just represents areas where there were at least a few people pointing these things out.

I know you're busy with advising and all, but let's use this opportunity to help make this department better.

As most of you know, changes in the Core Education component require students entering or transferring in to take two (2) writing intensive courses as part of graduation requirements.

We will need to find courses here which meet those requirements, such that students can earn CJ or FI credit while also meeting the Writing Intensive component.

This actually fits well with our upper-division courses where writing should be a large component of what students are doing.

One concern faculty sometimes express is that they are not English faculty, ergo, they're concerned about "grading" writing. That is not what this is about--rather, it's using writing to teach the subject. That can involve a number of techniques but often includes a method of feedback on writing and its subsequent improvement.

There are ways to incorporate a significant writing component without it becoming an undue grading burden. I use 1-page papers, and have in the past even used 25-word Precis to meet writing requirements. Done correctly, these can be relatively pain-free to grade.

The procedures for instituting and listing writing intensive courses are being finalized, but if you'd like to do this in the fall, please let me know. I expect that we will limit section sizes in these classes.

Pat and I met with Dave Carson of the Rockford School District and Lori Sweeney, Deputy Chief of the Rockford Police Department last Friday; we had an excellent meeting, and the Rockford Police Department is interested in this project as well. We may find qualified instructors there which would enable a face-to-face experience for Rockford students. Dave noted that students were asked to indicate interest in the program; 85 signed up! Then Dave dropped the other shoe: he says the OTHER THREE high schools also want to get in on this.

That can't happen this time around, but it's indicative of the potential of this effort. We also have interest in our doing something similar here in Wisconsin with rural schools, stitching together large enough section sizes from several rural schools using distance learning technology and remote teaching.

All of this will involve some work but I keep reminding myself that a lot of other places would like to have our problems. :)

I know that question 5 is supposed to skip them to question 9 if they haven't experienced it, but question 8 is about using tobacco, so there's a sequencing issue here.

You'll need to fix the "disagree" in the first matrix questions. Also, some of the other "yes/no" questions might also be likert items, such as questions 1-4 as well as a few others.

We're in the final stages of working out a MOU (memorandum of understanding) with costs, what we supply, and so on. We're hoping to have this all put to bed in 30 days or so.

700-HOUR ACADEMY UPDATE

We have a tentative meeting scheduled with Training and Standards people in Madison on March 7. They haven't confirmed a time yet.

They have offered to work with us here at UW-Platteville in creating an academy embedded in the program. We're not sure exactly what that

means, and part of the puzzle is how to include those elements without sacrificing any of what we do currently, which nobody here is interested in doing.

That meeting will give us a better idea of where they can work with us to allow modifications that fit what we do here.

CAUTIONS IN OUR TEACHING

Exams

I want to remind everyone that over-reliance on multiple-choice exams in our classes--especially upper-division classes--is a weak style of assessment. Students can sometimes guess their way to a passing grade where they could never pass an exam that required them to produce that knowledge without being prompted.

While it may occasionally be desirable to include such exam questions, I hope everyone is working to move away from that style of teaching in the upper-division courses and toward more rigorous styles of assessment.

If you would like some ideas on how to do this, please feel free to meet with me or staff at the TLC. There are ways to do this that don't result in huge and difficult grading loads.

Videos

As well, an over-reliance on videos in classroom settings is counter to what we provide that no recorded material can provide: face-to-face interaction with highly qualified faculty.

Especially where students may watch videos outside of classroom time, using class time for videos can have the effect of cheating students out of the interaction they've paid for.

This is not to say they should never be used; in the interviewing class, for instance, short

clips illustrating mannerisms, body language, and so on are quite appropriate in demonstrating and analyzing interview subjects. And there are other opportunities where video usage in class is appropriate.

Extra Credit

Extra credit is a difficult issue; over-reliance on extra credit can teach students that they do not have to do their best work at the outset, since they know they can "fix" a mediocre performance with extra credit. People will do what we incentivize them to do, and extra credit sometimes gives students incentive to do less than their best.

As well, please be careful in using extra credit in areas that have no content connection to our courses; allowing extra credit for donating blood, for instance, isn't defensible when it comes to assessing our students' performance in our courses. Our assessment should be directly tied to course objectives, and blood donation clearly is not that.

Returning Exams

I have never given an exam which I have not returned to students; all students should be able to take their exams and assess their studying performance in light of where they were successful and where not. That is, if a student missed a question, they should be able to go back and determine what in their study approach failed to work.

I know some of you review exams in class in lieu of returning them to students; I have some concern that this burns up valuable class time as well as not providing students the opportunity to use the exam to go back and assess their studying. Perhaps you overcome this by allowing students to review the exam in your office, but if the purpose of this practice is simply to avoid having to make new exams each time, it opens us up to other issues.

That is, this approach to using the same exam each time depends on absolute certainty that no copy of the exam has leaked out, or that no students have access to the test bank or instructor guide. Please be very careful with this. I had reports last semester of some academic dishonesty on the part of some of our students, which reports I could not substantiate but which I do believe. I had no reports in relation to any particular exam, but we can be sure that if a few students will take liberties in one area, it's likely they'd take them in another.

If our exams are not known to be "pure" in that no student knows what is going to be on them, then we can have issues defending our grading scheme. Let's be sure we don't have these issues.

Group Work

Be careful in how you require group work among students. Unless there is a significant individual component to the group grade, experience indicates that in such groups, the strongest students bear a disproportionate share of the work, as they are the most motivated; weaker students often just hang on the strongest student coattails, earning better grades through the work of other students than they deserve. So it becomes both an equity issue as well as grade inflation issue.

When this happens, our grading schemes come open to criticism. When individual effort is confounded with group results, it isn't as clear what grades mean. I have occasionally used group projects in the past; when I do so, I always use an individual component to the grade, so that students realize that disengaging from the project will not reward them.

If you'd like to explore ways to do this, contact me about it.

Their Money's Worth

I've long used a particular approach to assessing my own teaching. I ask myself, if my own children were in my classes, would I feel they were getting their money's worth? Students pay dearly for every class period in which they are enrolled, so I never want to waste that investment in their education. I always want them to walk out of my classes feeling they received their money's worth for what they received, and a bit more.

REASONS FOR BEING ABSENT

I've been asked what kinds of things are legitimate reasons to miss a class. Of course, illness, or a family member who is ill or for whom we must care or be involved in care, hospitalization, or other related things are legitimate reasons why we must miss a class. Each of us has sick time we can use to accommodate this.

Attending a conference or presenting a paper at a professional meeting is another legitimate reason to miss a class. While it would be nice if these would occur when we don't hold classes, sometimes that's not the case. Maintaining our professional competence is part of our responsibility to our students and this is one way we do that.

Occasionally there may be events which have significant impacts on our students which require us to miss a class. This was something both Pat and Rex experienced in the fall when they went to Madison to deal with issues surrounding the 700-hour academy.

There are ways to deal with this that limit the damage to our students' resulting education. One is to schedule exams during times we must be absent and arranging for proctors to give such exams. I'm available to help with that as are, of course, most of our staff. When that can't happen, perhaps a guest speaker may be scheduled or another faculty member can pinch-hit for us in a topic area in which they have expertise. Finding some way to give our students meaningful educational experiences during their scheduled and paid-for class time should be our priority.

When events provide only short-term opportunities to plan (see the 700-hour academy issues above), that may be difficult, but we should always be striving to give our students what they pay for. I know most of you are diligent in this regard, and I hope the above clarifies this. If you're not sure, talk to me about a proposed absence.

700-HOUR ACADEMY UPDATE

We remain unclear as to the exact ramifications of the 700-hour academy on our students who wish to enter a Law Enforcement career path in Wisconsin--except they don't look good. It makes it more difficult and more expensive for students who do not have an agency sponsorship, and makes it less desirable for students to earn a BS degree prior to entering the academy. Reducing the proportion of our police force who have earned bachelors degrees is not a good thing.

A few of us (Rex Reed, Joe Lomax, Pat Solar and myself) have variously testified at a legislative hearing, met with DOJ training and standards staff, and met with Rep. Bies who is sponsoring the legislation related to this bill. I met yesterday with Representative Travis Tranel to discuss our concerns as well as the degree of cooperation we've received from DOJ.

One option that is being discussed by Rep. Tranel and DOJ is the option of offering an Academy here at UW-Platteville, where students graduating with a BS with a LE emphasis would be certifiable at graduation, rather than after an additional academy. While appearing attractive at one level, the devil is in the details and much would depend on how flexible DOJ is on how the curriculum is presented and instructor staffing--a flexibility they have yet to demonstrate.

I'd like to talk about this a bit at our meeting on Tuesday. Bring ideas and questions.

ROCKFORD UPDATE

The Rockford initiative to offer advanced standing at UW-Platteville to Rockford HS students who complete coursework there prior to admission here is moving forward. We're at the stage where contract is being discussed.

This has the potential to improve the diversity of our students, pre-prepare students who will be well-positioned to succeed here in our program, provide a good recruitment path for maintaining enrollment numbers, and will even provide us with additional funding--which I'd like to use in part to do things like provide releases for research and ways to reduce some of our section sizes.

Assuming we're able to complete this, our first task will be to find someone who can do teaching from Platteville via distance learning methods. I expect such a position to include not only compensation for the year's teaching, but there is also funding for curriculum development and training and coordination with Rockford personnel who will be involved.

If you'd like to be involved with this, please let me know. Developing/converting FI 1320 curriculum for the first year's class is the first order of business.

Even better if you have identified such a student. Prerequisite: they need to have a good GPA and be a CJ or FI student. Sophomore or above.

If you know of any GRADUATE students in house with whom you could work, let's talk.

Meeting on Training and Standards

Last week Wednesday Rex Reed, Pat Solar and I traveled to Madison to the Training and

Standards meeting addressing the change in curriculum for LE Academy. The proposed new curriculum totals 700 hours, which cannot be done in a summer as previous. This seriously disadvantages our students and programs at a number of levels, and we have been discussing ways to alter the trajectory.

Below is an email I sent to folks at UW-Parkside, UW-Oshkosh, and Viterbo detailing the results of that meeting:

Today's meeting with the Training and Standards went about as I expected, which means they demonstrated little apparent interest in our concerns about the consequences of a 700-hour Academy on our CJ graduates.

Our position to them was that there is a great deal of redundancy between what we teach here at UW-Platteville (and by extension, at the other 4-year schools in Wisconsin graduating CJ majors) and what is taught in the Academy.

We argued that if students could pass the proficiency exams they expected their own students to pass, that our students would have met the requirements. This went over like the proverbial lead balloon. They argued that all their content must be taught by their own certified instructors, after which the proficiency exams would be applied. We could not get them to either agree or apparently understand that the outcome measure that is important is the quality of the students we graduate, and that if they students could pass the proficiency exams, the instruction would by definition be adequate.

Their argument was that they taught the content just prior to the hands-on elements of the training, such that learning about warrants, for example, would occur just before learning how to execute one.

Given the increase in cost which students will bear, the increased time during which they will have no job, our concern is that many students will opt out of the 4-year experience and simply complete a 2-year Associate's degree. We cannot see how this enhances the quality of police officers in the State of Wisconsin, given the increasingly complex environment in which policing is done.

The only bright spot of the day is that they appear to be backing down somewhat on the physical requirements. While we don't know what those will eventually be, it appears they are moving in a less-onerous direction.

Our next step here is to make our case to other state stakeholders. We believe that there is room for both a 700-hour academy as well as a shortened academy, at say approximately 500+ hours, in which college graduates with proficiency in areas like constitutional law, interviewing, criminal justice theory, definition of crime, crime scene investigation, and the like, would be able to complete the requirements with credit for our work in the 4-year schools.

Hi everyone,

It is now very clear we are a little bit dysfunctional as a result of the department not doing what it was suppose to do. That is decide on the qualifications and hiring priorities of the tenure-track position we're charged with. And since it was recommended that we take this process seriously, it would be a good idea to hold off with skype interviews until we get a handle on what and how exactly we are rating candidates. Additionally, there has been a "little" to "extensive" bullying taking place regarding this search process starting as early as august and continuing to yesterday--another reason to step back and reassess the process.

The good news is that the announcement was written vague enough that we likely can decide on job description/qualifications at this point in time rather than have to go back and actually do an official department vote and restart the whole process--although if we were to be serious about the process that is what I actually recommend we do, follow college/university bylaws, or at least get the department's permission to go forward with our finalized qualification/selection points.

With that, I will get us started by submitting the attached qualifications,corresponding weights, and dimensions/indicators.

Priority 1 is a criminal justice faculty member that can effectively advise future criminal

justice professionals and effectively teach and enhance a broad range of criminal justice subject areas.

Priority 2, 3, 4 is a criminal justice faculty member that can cordially collaborate with and assist a significant amount of colleagues here in the department, with an outside agency or more, and possibly undertake in research of significance.

Lastly, it is a bonus if they have grant/funding potential or significant qualifications for race/minority courses.

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> Classroom observations are often used as part of the faculty evaluation process. Generally, the observations are conducted at the end of the term with the sole purpose of completing required evaluation forms. However, if institutions are focused on learning, the intent of observations must shift from an evaluation tool to a valuable set of experiences designed to support faculty and improve the quality of teaching and learning.

> This webinar will introduce an ongoing observation program that contributes not only to learning, but also to the professional development of academic leaders and faculty. Implementing this type of program enables them to recognize and reinforce good practice, to identify ways of improving teaching and learning, and to highlight practice that should be shared more widely. In all these ways it contributes directly to the quality of the students' learning and experience at the institution. Participants will also develop critical skills needed to provide specific and actionable feedback following a walk-through classroom observation.

Finding Ways to Release Faculty/Staff

One thing that has struck me in the two-plus months I've been here is that our faculty work as hard or harder as any on campus. Between overloads, advising huge numbers of students, grading writing proficiency exams--we do a lot.

We have some resources available which we could devote to methods to relieve some of the load. I'm thinking about not only things like possibly teaching assistants but other methods to relieve the advising burden. Joe Lomax and Ben Lilligard are working on that this fall, and we're hopeful we can come up with a model that will do that.

If you have any ideas how we can devote resources to release faculty/staff from some of these loads, please let me know.

Rockford's a Go

I received word last night that the Rockford initiative--where high school students would take FI and CJ classes as juniors and seniors and then earn advanced standing here at UW-Platteville, is a go.

We were put under a severe time crunch to get a proposal in; I consulted a number of you about it, and the model has students, as Juniors, taking FI 1320 Intro to Crime Scene Investigation; Seniors in their fall semester would take FI 2420, Evidence Collection and Preservation, and in their spring semester would take CJ 1130 Intro to Criminal Justice. This would provide students with up to 8 credits of advanced standing. I expect the first offering to be in Fall, 2014.

This is an important initiative for several reasons--it should help improve the diversity of our student populations, it is a recruitment source for us, will help us maintain enrollments as demographic trends change, and it broadens our recruitment area. There is even interest in looking to expand this model to Iowa and Wisconsin, and to other programs.

Horrific Crime Scene Revisited

Just a reminder (as if you needed it), the Horrific Crime Scene Revisited is this coming Wednesday from 12-8pm at the FISCH house. This year, Diana Johnson and Dana Cecil are working with the Criminal Justice Association to put on this masterpiece. It seems like a nice bookend for CJA to be involved in this--Career Fair in the spring, HCSR house in the fall.

Cheryl, would you show these to Patrick, so he knows what the course looks like? The way it works, there are five targets. The one with the red post is the "stop plate." The competition is that one points the pistol at the cone as a ready position and at the beep of the timer, you have to shoot all five targets as fast as you can (10 rounds in the gun--so if you use 10 rounds to get all 5 targets, that's OK. Eight rounds fast is better than five rounds slow :).

The last target you hit has to be the stop plate. There's some sort of signal sent from the stop plate to the timer which stops the time.

We do this three times on each stage, and count the two best times. Times four stages. Lowest total time wins.

Sabina, you have this so you can see what Roger was shooting at. :)

Pat, I hope we can find a fifth--between the two Patricks, Roger, and myself, that's only 4 of us.

I spoke with Cathy Kutka yesterday and asked her about the places we were advertising--and there may be a misunderstanding here.

There are two or three places they place ads for us--but everything else, the committee is responsible for doing. They place ads in the Chronicle, but in something like the American Criminal Justice Association (or whatever)--that's on us.

Thus, any place we said we'd advertise that we forwarded to Cathy--that they aren't doing--is on us. We might need to devote some money to that need. Last year in the search that produced Claudine Pied, the Social Sciences department spend, IIRC, about \$1250 in advertising fees in places like the American Sociological Association.

We have budget to do this. I suspect this is why our application numbers aren't at the level I would expect. If we *have* already put ads out in all the places we indicated on our recruitment plan, let's find other places we might do this. For instance, the American Sociological Association is one such place we *should* be advertising.

I'm glad to see this going forward.

As a suggestion: I'd encourage you to make sure your probationary faculty member knows about the TLC "mid-term evaluation" possibilities.

Mid-term evaluations are produced for them by the TLC and are only seen by the faculty member, not the chair and not the DRB. They're a way for faculty to improve outside the evaluation process.

I have found them helpful in the past, and I'm using it again this semester in a new course I'm teaching. As a general rule, end-of-semester student evaluations improve as a result of using mid-term evaluations. Faculty whose student evaluations (question 10) are not routinely and mostly in the "4" range or higher should be looking seriously at this and other methods of improving their teaching.

FULL TIME FACULTY/STAFF HAVE \$500 in DEVELOPMENT MONEY AT THEIR DISPOSAL

Thanks to a serious amount of funding coming to the department from the online Masters program, each full-time faculty member and staff will have \$500 at their disposal for personal professional development, items they need to purchase to do their job, travel, whatever.

This money can be used for anything related to your job performance: membership in a professional society, travel money to a conference, even something like a whiteboard for your office (I did this last year in my old office). As long as you can demonstrate how its expenditure either helps you with professional development or otherwise helps you do your job, that money is yours to invest in your career as you please. The money expires at the end of the semester; we will not expect to do carryovers unless, e.g., a conference is in the summer. Physical items will remain the property of the University.

I'm expecting we can do something like this each year into the future; it's how the Social Sciences department does it, though their allocations per faculty are less.

I will review requests but don't expect to need to do much unless you're ordering beer or some other difficult-to-defend expenditure. :) And as far as computers or Ipads or some such: there are administrative hurdles to jump through, and such items would remain the property of the University. If that's something that would help you, let's talk about it and see if there's a way to make it happen.

ADDITIONAL MONEY FOR OTHER PROJECTS

I also expect we will have additional money for other development projects or department expenditures that exceed what would be doable under the \$500 limit. If, for instance, you are attending a conference to present a paper and additional travel money is desired, let me know. We can supplement for specific professional development activities.

SOUTHWEST TECH CHALLENGE

The details have been nailed down. We're being challenged on Saturday October 26th at the Southwest Tech Fennimore facility. The UWP Sportsmen's Club Pistol Team is shooting that morning starting at 9:00am; Tom Kretschman tells me that we'd shoot the challenge after that, and he expects it would all be done by noon.

Here's the setup: there are four "courses" each composed of 5 steel targets. Each shooter has 10 rounds with which to hit those five targets as quickly as possible, starting at a "low ready" position (no holster). From the "beep" the job is to get those 5 targets in the shortest time. It doesn't matter how many rounds, five or ten; what matters is the speed they're knocked down at.

Each shooter will do that three times per course, and their "high" time will be dropped, leaving them 2 times per course, or 8 total times. The final tally is the total of those 8 scores.

The course will be set up for practice on Tuesday Oct. 15th and Oct. 22nd. We can carpool up there as desired.

From each squad, the top five shooters' scores will count toward the trophy. I also noted that we'd draw from family members as well. Thus, there's no particular concern about pressure; if we have 8 or 9 shooters, still only the best 5 shooters will count.

I hope we can get a lot of people to do this--it'll be fun, and why not? We have a couple aces in the hole in the Patricks, Solar and Fuller. And maybe a few others (not me).

I spoke w/ Cathy Kutka late yesterday, and she indicated that our ads were going out in the standard outlets. We need to be sure the ad is in the other outlets that we mentioned, and as soon as we can do that.

Cathy also mentioned her willingness to do a brief, 15-20 minute presentation to the search committees regarding the TAM system. All apps are now required to be electronic, and manipulating that system is not rocket science, just a little different. I recommend you schedule Cathy to meet with your committees so as to streamline the process.

I also asked about whether diversity advocates had been appointed. Not

as of yet, but I think they're close. She is, btw, impressed with the speed with which you are doing this.

99+ PERCENT OF PROBLEMS CAN BE HANDLED LOCALLY

Sometimes we forget that most problems can be solved, quickly and relatively painlessly, by nothing more than sitting down and talking about them. Approaching conflict as if it were akin to lawyers battling in front of a jury rarely works well, and sometime escalates conflict to a place we'd rather not go.

I believe that 99+ percent of problems can be remedied quickly by simply talking. If we have an issue, let's get it out there and discuss it. Sit down with whomever you have an issue and work it out. Most times, a perceived slight or personal disagreement can be handled locally and sometimes, it's just a misperception. We can agree to disagree without being disagreeable.

Please respect the chain of command; administrative higher-ups may tend to look askance at those who cannot or will not honor it. Remember that when we choose to move up the chain, it's not only about what we say, it also reflects on those who are saying it. Make sure, should you ever choose to do that, you are willing to accept how you might look to others.

Generally, decisions made are simply that--decisions taken without any kind of malice aforethought. I haven't agreed with every decision administrators have thrust on me. I also don't always know all the considerations that went into the decision but, in the end, it's not my call. We have to respect that or we don't have an organizational structure--we have a rabble. And we are not a rabble.

You all are doing great things--we have terrific students, you work very hard and that speaks well to the reputation we have of putting students first. In fact, that is the first element of our mission statement: providing our majors with the best possible education in criminal justice. I think about that every day--and about the people who make it happen.

I ran across an article titled "The logic behind 19 common interview questions." It's a bulleted list with the question as well as the presumed intent and underlying logic.

While many, perhaps most, of them are not relevant to our own interviewing of candidates for faculty positions, I found the article causes me to think, up front, what we're looking for when we ask a specific question.

Some of the questions, with a little tweaking, could work for us in some contexts. Regardless, they are on point in this regard: what are we trying to elicit with our questions? This is relevant for both a Skype interview as well as a face-to-face interview.

In the end, I think interviews, both Skype and F-to-F, should put candidates under some level of pressure. Softball questions do nothing to tell us what's inside a person, and good questions will help us

winnow the best candidates from the rest.

One of the resources available to us as instructors is a process known as "mid-term evaluations."

This process allows you to "take the temperature" of a class at approximately the mid-term point of the semester. The Teaching and Learning Center offers this service where they will come in, administer a mid-term evaluation to your class, and provide you with the results.

Nobody else in the department will be privy to the results; not me, not

the DRB, nobody. They are yours to use how you see fit.

As a rule, I've found overall end-of-semester evaluations tend to improve when faculty avail themselves of this option and listen to the results. If you have a class that is a particularly "sticky wicket" for you, midterm evals can provide valuable insight.

I've used them in the past and they were helpful in identifying areas I could improve.

I am going to use a Midterm Eval this fall in my Sustainability course; it's a new course, I'm doing some different things, and I want to see if I should be making any mid-course corrections. For me, it's a diagnostic and a way to engage in continuous quality improvement.

Here are some thoughts:

I'd remove the "J.D. Law Degree" thing. They need a PhD. Period. I don't think we need to say what non-PhD degrees don't qualify; none of them do.

How about "ABDs will be considered for the position but they must have defended their dissertation prior to the start of the contract period if hired." When we hired in our department last year, we decided we didn't want anyone who was still working on their dissertation; it distracts them from what we want them to do here. What do you think? Will it limit our pool too much to do that?

How about something like "The successful applicant will have a strong record of teaching and will have background in cultural awareness, race, ethnicity and crime issues."

As far as the research side, I'd think anyone having done a dissertation would qualify w/r/t university research experience. Might be able to remove that.

I'm wondering about the "university service" part; someone working on their dissertation probably has little or none.

Your thoughts?

BTW, I spoke w/ Tim Zauche today about their search for a SRES tenure track faculty member, and he said that they had to have the advertisements "out there" only about 15 days before they could start reviewing applications.

I bring this up because we may be able to move ahead more quickly than I'd hoped. If that's so, and we can get approvals, it seems almost like we could possibly be looking at on-campus interviews....maybe even before Thanksgiving? Or at worst, right after?

Hi Mike,

Attached are the announcements that I had for the Criminal Justice and Forensic Sciences position searches. I have made comments in both, but the Criminal Justice document in particular has highlighted text because I had found two different versions. What is highlighted is the text that differed based on the position qualifications/requirements.

I'm also attaching a spreadsheet with the positions in the CJ department, a listing of US institutions with CJ programs, a listing of HBCUs, and a listing of HSIs. The positions listed in the spreadsheet are sorted by pay basis, primarily because we wouldn't assign an open position for a summer appointment to a search. The open positions list the last person to hold that position; filled are, of course, currently filled by the person listed. The list of CJ programs does not include contact information at this time, although it's something I will

have our student employee work on for the future. Also, it appears that none of the HBCUs offer above a master's degree in criminal justice, but there is an HSI institution that has a doctoral program in Forensic Psychology as well as Criminal Justice. I also added a quick spreadsheet with sites on which I had found other CJ/Forensics openings. The number of openings and the price may have changed since I last looked.

COURSE STAFFING UPDATES

We've filled the vacant sections of FORENSIC courses, slowly but surely. Aric Dutelle will teach the Fingerprinting course, Steve Elmer will do the Photography Course, Josh Grabandt will teach the Crime Scene Preparation class and labs, Ken Wiegman will teach the Evidence Collection and Preservation class, and Todd Kasper, Rick Lawrence, and Amy Hartwig will do a section of Intro to CSI. Two sections of Intro to CSI remain to be staffed; I am waiting to hear back

Diana Johnson will be supervising the teaching of the Intro to CSI courses and CSP course.

COMPREHENSIVE COMPONENT TO COURSES

As the re-accreditation of the university nears, one thing we need to be sure our courses include is some type of comprehensive assessment or capstone in each of our courses. This is part of the evaluation process the accrediting agency uses. It can be a variety of things; for example, a comprehensive final exam, a final paper or project that pulls together the elements of the course, and so on.

As some examples, here is how I do it in my courses: In my Principles of Sociology class, the final exam is taken from questions taken verbatim from the first four exams. Students have to go and master the answer to every question on every exam, and they can't just memorize letters; I mix up the answers!

In my Social Research class, the first half of the course is statistics while the second half covers more traditional methodological concepts like conceptualization, measurement, sampling, experiments, causality, surveys, and the like. The comprehensive project is to do a research design including not only what students would study but they must also explain their conceptualization, measurement, sampling technique, as well as how they expect to analyze the data, what statistics they would use, hypotheses to be tested, determination of statistical significance, and conclusions.

In my Crime and Delinquency course, students do a ride-along with the Platteville Police. They must write a paper tying together the theories from the course with the events they observed or the experiences of officers with whom they rode during the ridealong.

So, there are many ways you can demonstrate a comprehensive component to the course. If you have any questions about this or want to bounce ideas off me, or have a course in which this is difficult, please feel free to stop in.

EXTRA CREDIT

I want to caution you about how you use extra credit. I've heard of instructors—not in our

department, btw—who are arbitrary in how they allow extra credit. A student comes to them, hat in hand at the end of the semester, begging for additional work to bring up their grade. The instructor grants that, but in so doing, the instructor has now created a non-equitable system of grading. That is, what is in the syllabus is not true, and some students have opportunities others do not.

This can lead to accusations of favoritism or worse.

It is difficult to defend a system where what is offered to one is not offered to all. So my suggestion is to make your policy on extra credit, if you use it, clear and equitable. Make up work for a student who has experienced a life crisis is a different matter.

If and when I get time, I might take a look at that, but i have to tell you: It's not high on my list of priorities, Sabina.

I just added names according to the retained email names in my own email client, and his just happened to have that attached to it. It's nothing I ever added intentionally or otherwise, as the client must have added that from some email I replied to at some point in time--and frankly, my goal here was to get timely information out to people.

Sabina, when I was Platteville City Council President, do you know how people addressed me almost exclusively? Either Mike or Mr. Dalecki. Was I bothered by that? No. And that was for a very specific reason: my value isn't based on the initials behind my name, or the honorific preceding it. It is based on what I can do, and how I carry myself professionally. In the end, I wanted to be judged on what I did, not on extraneous things like my honorific. IMO, demanding people use honorifics has the same consequence as putting up fences between people.

Oh, there are times when it's useful--I probably won't ever introduce you to a student as anything other than Dr. Burton (maybe Dr. Sabina?) ,

because there *needs* to be an overt understanding presented to young people about boundaries and expertise, and honorifics do that. I often sign my emails to students as "Dr. D." And honorifics can have value in our dealings outside our inner circle; they can help establish credibility.

I was about to offer you a colloquialism but remembered how that worked out the last time :) so I'll just note it in more general terms: the more people focus on the small things, the more difficult it is to know what the big things are.

You must know that I respect you, and I understand that there are issues in regard with how you felt you were treated. I understand that and hope you realize that some of the decisions I've already made are an acknowledgement of that.

Sabina, that time in your life is over. I am not the guy I replaced, and I need your help and advise.

I expect you to be central in this department now in terms of defining how we go forward; I need you to be my model of professional behavior I can point probationary faculty to as someone they should emulate. This is a lot of pressure on you at one level--because I don't have that many tenured faculty I can use in that role. I need to be able to say to faculty, probationary and otherwise: be a professional, like Sabina!

And I'm very serious about that, Sabina. You do a lot of incredible stuff; we need that to be a standard to which others can aspire.

I know there is a way you felt you needed to approach the previous chair; I'm not that guy, Sabina. I need you to give me a break; let the small stuff slide. How I see your value in the department has already been demonstrated visibly to others. They know what I believe about you and your role in the department.

We're moving ahead, and I have to believe you're going to like and support that direction--after all, you're going to be a big part of that. We're going to have fun going forward! But give me a little time here because it's going to take time.

I've got a pretty full plate here right now, filling positions, getting advising settled (Aric's and Danelle's absences have produced ~175 advisees with no advisor!), getting budget settled, Patrick is a new faculty member, etc. If there's anything I can do to help, please let me know. Crises will make it on the first page of things to do, but less critical items might take some time to rise to the top.
