### REVIEW:

What is the intellectual merit of the proposed activity?

The PIs intend to develop a multi-disciplinary curriculum designed between the private sector, government, and academic institutions with the objective of educating students in the interests of establishing a resilient cyber ecosystem. The PIs are proposing a long-term plan to create a BS degree in Cyber Science.

The main weakness of the proposal is the lack of specification and providing detail of how the proposed activities will be done.

The proposal addresses the management plan and a good timeline, which is the strength of the proposal.

The team could be chosen more effectively, a couple of PIs lack solid publication record in the topic of the proposal.

What are the broader impacts of the proposed activity?

One of the strength of the proposal is that plans to focused on non-traditional undergraduate students, veterans and underrepresented groups.

The PIs address the dissemination plan through publications, conference presentations, maintaining a blog, etc.

Institutionalization has not been addressed in the proposal.  
Letters of support from the chair/Provost are missing.

## Summary Statement

The proposal lacks providing details. I suggest if they plan for resubmission in the future, they address the area of the weaknesses suggested by the reviewers.

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
