To Whom It May Concern;

The above named patient was seen in my practice today for abdominal pain. She has a history of a rather severe duodenal ulcer that was originally brought on by stress-induced increased acid production. She was treated and the symptoms eventually improved. She did fine over the summer, when her stress level was much lower.

Since returning to work recently at UW-Platteville, a series of investigations has caused her stress level to elevate again and she is starting to have the increased abdominal pain associated with formation of an ulcer. She is currently being treated for the acid production and for the stress, but she is in the midst of a pretty serious flare up.

I would recommend that the investigation be postponed for 4 weeks to allow the ulcer to settle down a little and lessen the chance of serious results such as perforation or bleeding. I am not involved in the investigation, and I do not know if this is possible, but I do recommend a delay to allow her to heal. She has restarted her treatment and 4 weeks may make a big difference in her health.

I recommend investigation be delayed from 9/12/16 until 10/9/16.
